INTERNATIONAL FOOTBALL.... ENGLAND v WALES AT WEMBLEY.

A crowd of 75,000 was among the records made at Wembley when the King and Queen attended their first war-time football game, in company with the King of Norway, M. Maisky, Cabinet Ministers and Mrs. Churchill. The England versus Wales International in aid of the "Prisoners of War" and "Aid to Russia" Funds.

England in the white shirts and Wales the dark. The start of play; good footwork by Matthews, England's outside right, carrying the ball to the Welsh goal mouth.

Carter scores the first goal for England. The well-tried and conventional methods of England's attack, begins to pay dividends.

Centre-forward Westcott stabs the second English goal past Poland.

More goals were netched up in this game than in any representative match at Wembley in either peace or war - and this looks like war.

Mrs. Churchill points it out to M. Maisky. It's the first Welsh Goal.

Lewrie scores brilliantly to open the account. It is now that a strong smell of leaks is noticed in the Stadium.

With the RR score at England 3 Wales 1, Lewrie does it again. A lovely bit of timing which sends the ball into the English goal and brings the Welsh score to two.

Resumption of play after half time, and back comes Westcott to alter the score beard again. The fourth English goal which gives them a lead of two over Wales, until the Welshmen score again.

Its almost a personal dual between the two opposing centre forwards.

But Westcott decides the match with the fifth and final goal. The score beard tells the history of dazzling forward play which has seldom been equalled.
