NEW RAY OF TUNISIA.

An immediate effect of events in Tunis was the deposal by order of General Girard of the Ray of Tunis, Sidi Kamef Pasha on account of his Axis sympathies. He is succeeded by the Ray de Camp, Sidi Lamin. As in many Mohammedan dynasties, the succession passes to the eldest surviving kinsman on the father's side. His Highness Sidi Lamin is the deposed Ray's uncle. The enthronement took place in the Palace de Bardo, Tunis.

General Jaia who has been appointed acting Resident-General is responsible for the security of the Regency, which France, as the protecting power, has undertaken to ensure.

Leaving the Palace after the ceremony, are many notabilities of the Court. While the deposed Ray is reported to have left for Madagascar with his 25 wives, his successor assumes power at a time when Tunisia enters upon (what we fully hope to be) a new and happier era.
