TITLE.CANAL OVER A CANAL.

Picture.: This astonishing engineering marvel is now in daily use at the Manchester Ship Canal.

Here are barges passing over the aqueduct -- or upper canal -- and here are the watertight gates closing across forming an enclosed trough.

The whole of this trough -- which is, of course, a section of the upper canal is then swung round on great steel roller paths, leaving the Ship Canal free for the passage of large vessels.

Here you see one such, -- a Glasgow steamer, -- passing up the Ship Canal, with the section of the upper canal lying alongside.

After the vessel has passed the huge aqueduct with its load of water -- weighing in all over fourteen hundred tons -- is slowly swung back into place -- and once again becomes a canal over a canal.
