TITLE.LONDON to BRIGHTON WALK.

Picture.:- Just before seven o'clock in the morning a hundred athletes assemble at Westminster for the walk to Brighton.

Big Ben's first stroke of the hour is the signal to start and they get sharply away.

Brignoli, an Italian competitor, sets the pace from the start, while Green, on the left of this bunch, settles down with others into a more comfortable stride. Then come the bulk of the competitors each tackling the first mile according to his own ideas.

The streets are hardly aired before they pass through Kennington in small groups.

At Crawley, twenty nine miles out, Green is already leading.

It's lucky that the railway level crossing gates are not closed against him.

Despite his spurt at the start Brignoli does well.

Green maintains his lead and has a refreshing sponge down without slackening his splendid pace.

At Brighton he comes in nearly twenty four minutes ahead of Ludlow of Derby, who was second man in.

Green's time shows an average of nearly six-and-a-half miles per hour over the entire fifty-two miles course. He beats the record which stood for twenty one years.
