TITLE.:- ST GEORGE'S CHAPEL

Picture.:- Windsor Castle, that stately royal residence on the banks of the Thames, is the scene of an historic--

--ceremony when St. George's Chapel, the home of the Order of the Garter is re-opened after having been closed ten years for restoration. The worshippers at the thanksgiving service are headed --

--by Their Majesties the King and Queen, Sovereign and Lady of the Order.

St. George's has been the Garter Chapel ever since the Order was founded by Edward the Third in 1348. The Prince of Wales, there he goes, was present at the service.

The heraldic "Kings Beasts" which were removed from their pinnacles on the advice of Sir Christopher Wren, have now been restored to their original places atop the beautiful building.

Over £175,000 has been spent--

--on restoring the ancient chapel, the cost having been defrayed by His Majesty, the Knights of the Garter, and other benefactors. It's not surprising that it needed restoring for, as we have told you, it is nearly 600 years old.

Everyone is glad the building is open once again.
