--crew are thought to be still imprisoned in the fuselage, or hull.

She had twelve persons aboard when she was cruising over Plymouth Sound. ... Suddenly she dived - striking the water with such force that the machine buckled and sank immediately...

Only three of the crew were saved. ... The fuselage is here being hauled --

-up, when it breaks in two, the portion carrying the engines sliding back beneath the waters of the Sound. ...
