(8). THE SEA HE BOVED.

-- last resting place is a fitting tribute to the memory of the famous artist.

"Nelson" and "Warspite" salute the sad cortege as it passes across Portsmouth --

--Harbour. Later in the five miles journey the cutter is taken in tow. The remains are to --

-lie in the churchyard of Forchester Castle, within a few yards of --

-- the sea he knew and loved so well and truly till the end.
