FOR THOSE IN PERIL - - U.S. naval authorities test novel rescue-chamber designed to save crews of stricken submarines. Point Loma, California.

Picture.:- To test a new invention for life saving from underwater craft, the United States submarine 'S.4.' becomes an--

--anchor, and sinks, not--

--submerges beneath the waves. ^{Surface} That's the only way the invention can be tried out.

Directly it is known that a boat is sunk, and cannot rise, the rescue party brings the--

great nine-ton steel ball to the spot where--

--the submarine was last seen. It--

--is then lowered to the sunken craft. Divers fasten it to the escape hatch,--

--the hatchway is opened,--

--and the imprisoned--

--crew emerge from a certain living death. These pictures--

--are actually taken from inside the rescue ball. A--

--crew of eight may be rescued at one--

--time. Before this the only solution was to rescue a submarine--

--by cables. In high seas, or stormy weather, nine times out of ten that method was not--

--possible. With this invention it is hoped--

--that tragedies which have shocked the world like the Poseidon, and the M.S. may in future be averted.
