--were heard. Two thousand tons of rock had slipped and wrecked a mission hall and several dwellings. In one house a sleeping girl of 11 years--

--was rescued from the only room which was not crushed by the fall. Many had--

--extraordinary escapes from being buried in their beds.

-outer wall of the Castle is only eight feet from the edge of the landslide.
