To carry out the ambitious Galloway water scheme, it is necessary to partially dam the waters of the famous selmon fishing river at Tongland, and--

--divert a flow to a large pumping house. There the pressure will be converted into power to supply the electrical needs--

-- of a vide district. Mechanical navies are removing a few hundred thousand tons--

--of earth to make room for the foundations of the diverting dam. When finished, ---

-- there will be a tremendous concrete mass, seventy feet high rising from the river bed.

The claims of the fine salmon which live in the river have not--

--been entirely ignored. A fish ladder is provided in the dam, up which the salmon may climb to pass--

-to the upper or lower reaches. This power scheme has provided work for hundreds of unemployed from distressed areas.
