Admiral of the Fleet Lord Wester Wemyss, "Redy Wemyss" as he was affectionately known to those who served under him, goes to his last berth. The mortal remains of this notable man are, by his own wish, drawn by a farm-cart through the grounds of Wemyss Castle to the place of burial.

Lord Wemyss commanded the 10th Cruiser Squadron at the beginning of the Great War and later commanded the East of the Eastern Expedition at Mudros.

As Britain's naval representative he signed the Armistice in the railway carriage at --

--Compiègne on the historic November 10th, 1918. His--
