After fifteen years of peace, a memorial to men of the Regiment who fell in the Great War is to be unveiled at All Souls Church, Langham Place. Men of the Old Comrades Association, and the serving troops are inspected by Major General W.P. Hill, their Colonel, prior to the service of Commemoration. To-day is also the anniversary of the Battle of Loos, in which the unit fought, and lost many men.

The Service at All Souls (next to Breakfast House,) by the way) is to be conducted by the Bishop of London. An impressive reminder of four terrible years, for those who wish to be reminded.
