Manchester believes in getting its money's worth. And at this fight it--

--gets it. Heavyweights may send you to sleep, but these fellows try all they know to put each other to sleep. As challenger--

--Dick Corbett is doing his best to fight Johnnie King to a--

--standstill, or a lie-still. There's King on the ropes. Corbett is boxing--

--like a miniature whirlwind. Right and left swings, upper cuts, hooks, straight punches, follow each other with lightning rapidity. (EFFECTS).

Just watch this, and listen to the crowd's excitement. (EFFECTS).

There's a fair amount of clinching, but a lot of fine fighting. King at present holds the two titles of British bantam-weight champion, and British Empire champion, but it's taking him all his time to defend them. (EFFECTS).

Corbett is boxing magnificently and his left hand frequently puzzles King.

I think the Manchester idol is falling, although he's fighting gamely.

Yes, Corbett has ~~won~~ -- before one of the best crowds ever assembled at Belle Vue. They may be disappointed that King didn't win, but they--

--recognise that Dick Corbett's win is the result--

--of skilful fighting. A good show by two game well-matched boxers.
