----fight open. He prefers range for his flashing right. Neusel wants to keep the pace, and make his extra stone weight work for him. On close

both sides, real hard hitting has been the order of the night, but Petersen's left is losing its weight -----

----and sting. Up till now the fight has----

---practically balanced itself round by round; now the German seems to be building -----

----upon strength while the Welshman weakens. Fa Petersen seems to----

---- the German onslaught. The Welshman is up again; the old
cut above his eye is open again, and bleeding profusely. His

---Petersen keeps calm-----

-----The eleventh round finds the champion rather groggy. His
footwork is sluggish -----

---he slips, recovers, and fights back gamely -----

-----Neusel's strength holds out remarkably. Jack Petersen's
taking terrific punishment, yet still shows occasional flashes
of his fine ringcraft. Neusel fights him to the-----

----ropes and gives no quarter. Petersen is practically out.
He almost collapses - does collapse - and hangs over the ropes.
The towel is held up and thrown in. -----

-----Neusel wins with a technical knock-out, and----

-----so ends one of the best heavyweight-----

---battles seen in England for many a heavyweight night.
