-places almost at the same time, which makes it very difficult for Orlando. The champion's punches are like lightning and nearly as deadly. A missed right swing, and the Italian goes to his knees.

He's up at once, misses badly again, and takes a shattering right to the head, which knocks him for six. He's up again - good man !

The Manchester man attacks as--

--consistently as a mosquito. BROWN shoots a staggering right to the jaw, and the referee--

--starts counting again. MAGLIOZZI doesn't get up this time. Out in the fourth round to the world's flyweight champion, whose punches are even better than they were when he--

-- gained the title. BROWN'S popularity--

--seems greater than ever. The packed Belle Vue cheers itself hoarse. Women are standing--

--on their seats, wildly fluttering hankies at BROWN, Britain's only world's champion.
