BROWN V LYNCH.

JACKIE BROWN, of Manchester,

eight-stone champion of the world, fights BENNY LYNCH of Glasgow for his titles, at

Belle Vue. JACKIE BROWN is spending a lot of time

on the floor, and LYNCH

is spending nearly all his time in keeping JACKIE there. LYNCH is the man who pasted the champ, and busted the record that JACK built. It has taken BROWN about five years to make his reputation,

and it is taking about the same number of minutes for him to lose it. The young Scott is like a whirlwind, and keeps BROWN dazed most of the time, despite the Manchester lad's valiant attempts to turn defeat

into victory. In fact, so eager is BROWN to turn the tables that

he gets up almost immediately after going down, and thus loses chances of full recovery. The ring-side starts a private fight of their own

in their excitement. Brown is game to the last, but Lynch

is the better man,

shorter, LYNCH is declared the winner, and takes three titles at once, becoming British, European and world's feather-weight champion.
