

TRAGEDY OF THE SEA.

TRAWLER WRECKED.

420-feet below this beetling cliff lies the wreck of the steamer trawler 'Skegness'. The heroic efforts of lifeboats, and a rocket party were unavailing. Eleven souls, comprising the crew were killed, or drowned. Now comes the grim work of sighting and recovering the bodies of the ill-fated seamen. An R.A.F. 'plane assists. Up the cliff, drawn by ropes, comes the body of Charles Johnson, Second Engineer, of Hall. Most of the crew were resident in Hall. The town mourns their loss. Speeton Cliffs, Bridlington, tower above the battered hull of what, a few days ago was a live ship. Huge North Sea rollers wash over her, moaning a dirge for those who gave their lives that we might eat.
