Picture.:- Another monument of the Great War is inaugurated. It commemorates the entry of the Leeds Pals into the dreadful affair. The Pals Battalion is the 15th West Yorkshire Regiment. The Cairn is unveiled by Lieutenant Colonel J.W. Stead, their first Commanding Officer. The tablet tells of the Battalion's decimation at the Somme, when every officer was killed, and only forty-seven men returned. The story of a massacre with far too many parallels during the four year's agony.
