HOMAGE TO LYAUTEY.

"MAKER OF MODERN MOROCCO".

Picture.:- From the Cathedral of Nancy, France, comes the coffin containing the remains of a great Frenchman, Marshal Lyautey. For a year his body has lain in the Cathedral. It now leaves for its final resting place honoured by all France, military, political, ecclesiastical.

Marshal Lyautey was the founder of modern Morocco, France's North African Empire. It is by the great soldier's own expressed wish that his body is removed for burial at Chella, near Rabbat, in the Morocco which he loved so well.

At Marseilles, native Moroccan officials and troops pay their respects as the Marshal goes aboard the vedette, taking his last farewell of French shores. The cruiser 'Dupleix' stands by with flag at half mast to receive the body. The 'planes overhead roar their adieu as the

cortege leaves, bound for Morocco. Meanwhile, life in the Moroccan interior takes its usual course.

The Sultan is feted at Marrakech. Scenes recalling the glorious period of Arab civilisation are re-enacted before His Majesty.

Dancing follows an open-air banquet. This sort of things goes on for hours, but our news-reel has its limits. One more scene. Commandant of the Territory receives from the Sultan a neck-tie of great honour. A medal would be less significant!
