Picture:- British, Spanish, and Italian warships salute the French cruiser Dupleix, as she passes through the straits of Gibraltar, carrying the embalmed body of Marshal Lyautey. On arrival at Cassablanca, the coffin is given over to the charge of an impressive guard-of-honour. The dead Founder of Modern French Morocco is received in this African colony as a king might be received. The destination of the coffin is Rabat, a modern town built under Lyautey's rule. This town is the Marshal's last resting place, and his burial here carries out his own last wish. The procession includes representatives of many nations, who pass into the great white mausoleum for the concluding rites. During his life Marshal Lyautey won many hearts, and his beneficent government of the Colony gained and held the respect of the whole population. Modern Morocco is his everlasting monument.
