of the strikers rather than hanging around, surrounded by sides of

beef hanging around. After this meeting the men adjourned to a hall, held

a secret session, press, cihema, or otherwise being excluded, at which they decided to continue

the strike, against the advice of Ernest Bevin. Mr. Zinges, the strikers'

organiser doesn't care if he does lose weight

over the stoppage of Lendon's meat supply. One lorry was loaded by amateurs, but on discovering that the van driver was from Covent Garden, it had

to be unloaded again. Some lucky butchers collected their own

supply, and are still telling us what <u>luv</u>ely legs they've get.
