disasters are everywhere. The city of

Johnstown is the hardest hit of all. Rumours fly that

the huge dam is bursting. To the

hills ery everybody, and thousands flee in terror.

This town has horrible memories of the flood of 1889,

when the khole town was

swept away, and 5,500 lives lost. Thirty-

thousand people are homeless in this town alone. No-one yet

knows how many are dead. The flood waters are slowly subsiding, but the angry swellen rivers give a

vivid picture of the terrifie

force that swept everything before it in the holocaust.

The residential section, finely planned and built is but

a skeleton of the once

great city of 66-thousand inhabitants.

Military law end the 9 p.m. surfew

is enforced by soldiers. The main

streets look like huge scrap heaps. Property worth three million pounds

has been destroyed in this one area. Red Gross

units are doing their

utmost under incredible difficulty.

Thousands of terror

stricken inhabitants stay huddled on

the hillsides afraid to re-enter the city. The desolation

is even more vivid when seen from the air. Mountains of debris,

waters as far as the eye can see. It is a horror

equalled only by war. A screen story such as I hope never to comment upon again.
