The great city of Sydney, New South Wales, was ablaze with light on the evening before the Royal Commonwealth Tour, brought the Queen to Australia. Before eight o'clock the next morning, the Gothic sailed into the huge harbour; the place of her New Zealand escort, had been taken by Her Majesty's Australian Ships Australia, Vengeance, Anzac and Quadrant..... cruiser, aircraft-carrier, destroyet and frigate. And the crowd of many thousands that had packed the waterfront overnight, was perched on every point of vantage to witness this most impressive arrival; with hundreds of little ships carrying their welcome out from the shore

Her Majesty and the Duke of Edinburgh, looked fit, and after their strenuous weeks in New Zealand, as they left the Gothic to go ashore in the Royal Barge --- to ride through the avenue of gaily-dressed little ships into Farm Cove. This was the place where the first Governor, first set foot on the soil of New South Wales --- a hundred and sixty-six years ago.

Her Majest y was officially received by the Governor-General of 1954 --- Field Marshal Sir William Slim; by the Governor of New South Wales, General Northcott; and by the Australian Prime replied to Minister, Mr Menziet. After their greetings, the Queen/rank the address of welcome.

Now --- let the spectacular drive through Sydney streets, be described by an Australian who was there

The Queen and the Duke were staying here --- at Government
House; overlooking Sydney Harbour. And in the grounds that
day, Her Majesty inspected the police escort that had brought her
through the crowded city

And now --- Australia tells us how that great day anded.
