on the slipway of John Brown's Clydebank Yard and ready for launching is a twenty-two thousand ton liner. Our cameraman goes aloft to get a crow's nest view of the second biggest Cunarder built since the war. It is designed for service from the United Kingdom to Canada--- and a thousand miles beyond the sea up the St Lawrence River to Montreal. Lady Churchill is there to launch it, accompanied by her daughter Mrs Christopher Soames. As the ceremony was performed it was good to learn that a sister ship has already been xixxed started and a third is on the way.

The name is Saxonia. She will carry a total of nine hundred and twenty-five passengers and a huge cargo. And among many refinements, she is the first Cunarder built with anti-rational rolling stabilisers.

At a time when all the world is airminded, it is good to hear of this kind of faith in the future of ships. British shipping must never be allowed to return to those days of despondency, during that occurred between the two world wars;
