This was the one-hundredth Varsity Boat Race. Up to this day Oxford had won fiftyxfamxximmxxf forty-four times, Cambridge fifty four with one dead heat. And despite the cold and windy weather there were big crowds out alongside the Thames as usual Campaint went the toss and chose the Surrey side of the river to get the shelter for the first part of the race. It's Oxford nearer the camera.

Both crews went off at a fast rate and in the first few strokes the Dark Blues mant pulled slightly ahead. Our camera in the following launch shows how in the early stages it was almost neck and neck.

Here's Oxford, coming up to Hammersmith Bridge,.... rowing strongly and holding on to their alight lead. And here's Cambridge.

The Dark Blue reached Hammersmith Bridge in seven minutes thirteen seconds --- one second shead of Cambridge.

But now --- in the reach after Hammersmith and passing Chiswick they caught the full force of the weather. It was here that Oxford showed their calibre, settling down to strong and steady rowing. But the water was so choppy even the swans packed it up.

coming up to Barnes Bridge there was only one crew in it --- and that was Oxford. They were lengths shead of their rivals and going with plenty in reserve

The finishing post lies just ahead. Last year it was a win for Cambridge --- but this time Oxford are going on to win by four and a half lengths.

Victory No. 45 for the Dark Blues; in twenty minutes, twenty-three seconds.
