and to the famous Abbey known as Monte Cassino comesthe President of Italy; reviving memories of ten years ago when town and monastery were a battleground; where hundreds who died are now remembered in a stone memorial.

In 1944 this Benedictine Managery Abbey of the sixth century, was the target for more than four hundred tons of bombs. And the arguments that raged at that time were no less bitter than the battle; should this ancient pile be destroyed whatever the needs of war? The answer was that the enemy was shielding behind the Abbey's ancient minner walls; and the lives of Allied soldiers, were decided more sacred than this am historic place.

In 1954, a procession through the town marks the restoration of a landmark that stood for hundreds of years, only to be destroyed forceful in virtually one day of modern war. A/pausage reminder, of the power that men wield taxatexxxxx in modern times --- for good or evil
