In fog and snowstorms six thousand feet up --- rescue teams have been searching for a missing party of three teachers and ten students in the Dachstein Alps of Austria. So harsh were the conditions that many of the rescuers were overcome by snow-blindness and glacier burns. So remote was the search area, that the parties had to be out eleven hours each day --- in order to search for only two hours

For nine days this heroic work went on; and hope grew grimly less and less. Then --- a stick belonging to one of the teachers was found.

From the State of Maine in America comes another rescue story --but this state a hoppy of a fourteen-year-old boy, Gary

Gorton, was swept from a bridge and was found hanging on for dear life
in midstream; spring floods had swollen the waters into the torrent
you see before you.

A local fireman tried to reach him, but had
to abandon his brave attempt

Fortunately, mechanical aid was near at hand: A repower fixed and a new phase of the rescue began

So Gary lived to tell the exciting story of the day he fell in the river; but when he shows the bridge where he fer fell in, he means to stand well back.
