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For the first public engagement on her return from the Commonwealth Tour, Her Majesty the Queen had a morning of bright sunshine as she drove with the Duke of Edinburgh from Buckingham Palace to the City Through smiling crowds giving another "welcome home", the EXEX state landau came to the city boundary at Temple Bar

And here, in accordance with the ancient custom, the historic jewelled sword was presented to the Queen by the Lord Mayor, Sir Noel Bowater; a tradition from the forgotten past --- symbol of royal justice --- which to-day serves also as a token of the happy unity that enfolds our throne and people

Already at the Manshon House, were Cueen Elizabeth the Queen Mother and Princess Margaret. Normally such a function as this City luncheon would be held in the Guildhall; to-day it was in the official home of the Lord Mayer, because the Guildhall is undergoing repairs to its bomb-damage.

Proudly mounting a guard of honour are the men of a famous corps with centuries of association with the City }-- the Honourable Artillery Company And inside is the presentation of a bouquet of orchids and roses by Lady Bowater, the Lady May oress.

The luncheon was held in the Egyptian Hall in a company of four hundred guests; and the toast proposed by the Lord Mayor was --- Her Majessy the Queen 27

Among the guests were the Prime Minister - and His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury. 7

In her berly, the Queen told as something of what her Commonwealth

And after lunch --- to crown a sparkling occasion --- the Queen and the Duke came out on to the Mansion House balcony, to wave to the cheering
