NAVAL MEMORIAL AT PLYMOUTH.

A Naval Memorial stands upon famous Plymouth Hoe. And Her Royal Highness, Princess Maggart Margaret, ---- received with a royal salute and a guard of honour mounted by Royal Navy and Royal Marines ---came to Plymouth to unveil the extension to the original memorial built after the First World War. The extension is in memory of more than fifteen in thousand who died in the war of 1939 -- 1945.

As well as those whose homes were in the British Isles, this Plymouth Memorial also contains the Roll of Honour of naval forces from all over the Commonwealth

Among those names of sailors, are the names of others whose wartime duty took them to sea with the Royal Navy on other business — --- the **XEXPX** reporting of the story of the war of fleets and convoys; to publish the tale of heroism that unfolded daily across the seven seas. This is the last of the Memorials to those whose grave to-day, is the sea on which they served.
