Members of the British Legion attended a Memorial Parade at the Cenotaph in London on the anniversary of D-Day..... and awarthx a wreath in homage to those who gave their lives was laid at the foot of the National Shrine by Sir Ian Fraser.

The service was conducted by the Dean of Westminster; and bands and drummers of Guards Battalions paid their tributes to old comrades of ten years ago.

Then --- with Standards at the "Carry--- Colours Flying" --- the parade marched past.
