the police horse, Winston. And she came out to the Mall escorted by
the Duke of Edinburgh and the Duke of Gloucester, for this celebration
of her official birthday --- saluted by a trampeters fanfaror ////

First of all, upon the Horse Guards Parade, the Queen inspected her rocklike ranks of Guardsmen; Coldstream Guards and Grenadiers; Life Guards and Royal Horse Guards; with Scots, Irish and Welsh Guards also represented in the Taxxxxx Massed Bands. ////

From a window overlooking the great parade, the royal family watched every moment of this centuries-old tradition. ////

Now the Massed Bands carry out their spectacular march --- first in slow time. ////

Then in quick time --- march and countermarch.////

This year the Colour to be trooped is that of the 1st Battalion Guards, the Coldstream/ which also provides the Escort. This Colour was presented to the Battalion by the late King George VI. ////

The Colour is now handed to the Ensign --- 2nd Lieutenant Egerton-Warburton. ////

Now --- the actual ceremony of the Trooping, along the ranks of Guardsmen.

The march past. In command of the parade, is Lt.-Colonel Crichton, M.C., Field-Officer-in-Brigade-Waiting. ////

Next --- the trot past of the Household Cavalry --- Life Guards and Royal Horse Guards. ////

And then --- following the Massed Bands --- the Queen rides at the head of her column of Guards, back to Buckingham Palace. ////

The ceremony is over; the Queen turns and rides in across the forecourt. And almost on the instant --- the smiling June day brings back its April showers

For the fly past --- three jet squadrons of the Auxiliary Air Force fly straight up the Mall; adding the salute of our modern age to the pageantry of years gone by.
