In perfect formation, four Sunderland Flying Boats came out of the clouds above Pembroke Dock in South Wales. This was the end of a flight from Young Sound; and on beard as passengers was a party of men who have been living in the Arctic Circle for two years. They were the members of the British North Greenland Expedition --- (led by Commander Simpson of the Reyal Navy)--- home after their long, scientific vigil.
