River Shannen is a K.L.M. Super-Censtellation. It had crashed two miles out from Shannon Airport at the start of its trans-Atlantic flight to New York. First news of the disaster was taken to the air terminus by one of the crew who sway from the plane and scrambled through the mud. Rescue operations from the jetty can be seen in progress.

Twenty-eight members of the passengers and crew lost their lives. They were mostly Americans and Dutch. The cap tain was the airline's senier pilor, Captain Viruly. Another of the crew who was saved was the Navigator, Johan Tieman. Among the passengers who survived the tragedy was a director of a Dutch tehacce company, mR De Brauwer. One of the American survivors was Mrs Charles Farrington of New York, who was rescued with her husband and children. The Airline President stated that the crash was so unexpected that therewas no time for the pilot to make an emergency landing.
