This is the practice Escape Tower --- a hundred-feet tower of water into which the sailer enters by way of the One Man Escape Chamber. He is equipped only with geggles and ness-Elip. This is called "free ascent" --- and, the breathing out throught the man mouth, he comes rapidly to the surface.

In addition to escaping, are the problems of keeping afloat ---- perhaps for a long time ---- and exposure. This type of immersion suit is now in service in all submarines.
