Then twenty-one-year-old Colin Cowdrey came in and made a magnificent stand with his captain

A fine drive sent up the century for Hutten,

And a leg-glance, sent up the hundred for the brilliant newcomer, Cowdrey

When New South Wales went in to bat, they only had to beat a total of two-fifty-two, and their captain, Keith Miller, scored eighty-six --- rattling up his fifty with a lively four.

But another brilliant newcomer to first-class cricket in

Apstralia, was Billy Watson --- who also scored a century. The

match was drawn.
