British fabrics at the home of Lady Camrose in London. It was
put on by the Top Twelve --- the Incorporated Society of London
Fashion Designers..... and it was, in fact, a preview of
fashions for the spring of 1955

Another royal occasion of the week was the Queen Mother's visit to the Medical School at at St Mary's Hospital in Raddin Paddington...... which started off with the presentation of medals and awards to successful students. And then --- in the foundation stone for the new school 3---- the Queen Mother placed a stop-watch to represent the breaking of the four-minute mile record by Roger Bannister, a former student of St Mary's And, from Sir Alexander Fleming, Her majesty received a penicillin mould. This, of course, represented the discovery of the wender-drup, by Sir Alexander, in the St Mary's Laboratories. The Queen Mother placed this also in the foundation stone, with the stop watch and three other articles of historic interest.

At Cardiff, the Duke of Edinburgh --- wearing the uniform of the Welsh Guards --- attended the City Hall for the ceremony which made him a freeman of this great city of Wales. A great honour --- but one which carries certain fairly stiff conditions.
