SNOW TRAINING.

In the Cairngorm Mountains, kn the Scottish Highlands, the hard weather of the winter of 1954/55 is has been turned to good account. These are some of the specially - selected affix officers and men of the Royal Marines, who are undergoing training, for warfare in snow and ice conditions. And it isn't merely a matter of training by day, and returning to the shelter of barracks or billets by night. It's a four-day patrol --- and home is a hole in the snow.

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The trainees spend three weeks many these frozen mountains which are among the highest and most remote in Britain. Given, May will spend training periods in the mountains of Norway and Canada.

And here --- at Chalgroven near Oxford**uttan**, is a demonstration of a new ejector-seat which is designed for service use. Its object is to enable pilot or crew to make an emergency parachute exit from an aeroplane --- even if the emergency arises, while the plane is still on ground level. even tougher.
