

On Clydeside they have built a new ship for the Canadian-Pacific service between Great Britain and Canada --- fifty years after the first ship of the same name was built in this same shipyard. And a huge crowd of something like 10,000 employees, had time off to watch the naming and launching ~~and~~ ceremony by [Her Majesty the] Queen^{ELIZABETH.} No fewer than sixty~~three~~ of them had also worked on that predecessor that was launched in 1905. The customary bouquet was shyly presented [to Her Majesty] by the grandson of the Chairman --- the Honourable Robert Bruce, aged two.

After hearing technical details about the ship from some of the experts concerned, [Her Majesty]^{QUEEN ELIZABETH} then performed the launching ceremony.

From the far side of the Clyde, the difficulty can be appreciated, of launching a 24,000 ton liner in such a confined space.

From the launching ceremony, Her Majesty the Queen went with the Duke of Edinburgh to Rosyth, where the royal yacht Britannia awaited their arrival. They were leaving for Oslo, on ^{their} three-day state visit to Norway.
