On Clydeside they have built a new ship for the CanadianPacific service between Great Britain and Canada --- fifty years
after the first ship of the same name was built in this same
shippard. And a huge crowd of something like 10,000 employees,
had time off to watch the naming and launching and ceremony by
Her Majesty the Queen. No fewer than sixty three of them had
also worked on that predecessor that was launched in 1905. The
customary bouquet was shyly presented to Her Majesty by the
grandson of the Chairman --- the Honourable Robert Bruce, aged
two.

After hearing technical details about the ship from some of the experts concerned, Her Majesty then performed the launching ceremony.

From the launching ceremony, Her Majesty the Queen went with the Duke of Edinburgh to Rosyth, where the royal yacht Britannia awaited their arrival. They were leaving for Oslo, on three-day state visit to Norway.
