A night-plane from Amsterdam, completing a journey from Prague, brought home to Britain a woman born in a county of England. It was the moment she had dreamed mant about during nine years behind the Iron Curtain. Seen after landing, Mrs Sispera was answering questions from for newspapers.

And this was the "welcome home" in the village of Thurston, in Suffolk, for Phyllis Sispera and her three children --- Jennifer, Clarence and Martin. This was the home she heft, when she married a Czechoslovakian radio operator serving with the Royal Air Force

This was the happy greeting from her father. A She was divorced from her husband --- and separated from her children. But diplomatic representations secured for her, the joy of returning to the land of freedom where she was born.
