For many thousands --- this pastoral setting for a racemeeting made the highpspot of a holiday. They came away for a rest
and change; the bookmakers got their change and the innut
landladies got the rest.

The first race --- the Craven Stakes, with fifther And loss the lead about three furlongs from home and held on to win by three lengths from Stenigot Top

Second Race --- the Mole comb Stakes. And watch for a swerve by Lord Derby's La Fresnes

La Fresnes was first past the post; but following an objection the Aga Khan's Palariva became the winner

Her Majesty the Queen --- who was guest of Goodwood's Patron, the Duke of Richmond and Adda Gordon --- was here to watch the racing. And hereshe is leaving the paddock, in those supercharged moments before the big race of the day --- the Stewards Cup.

A big field of twenty-six lined up at the start.

And now they re off --- on a six furlong handicap with Golden Lion favourite and King Bruce carrying top weight at a hundre to six. Roman Vale moved up early into the lead.

Now --- the finish. Roman Vale was still there and Golden

Lion was grimly hanging on --- but Billy Rickaby pushed King Bruce
just in front from Vale to win by a head
