The City of Winchester received the Royal Charter eight hundred years ago --- and to-day's children in the Pilgrim's School Playing Fields cheered the Queen when she arrived for the anniversary sistems celebrations of that great event of bygone centuries.

Her Majesty made presentations of medals to boys of Winchester's famous College --- the School founded by William of Wykeham in the year 1382.

The Queen then drove to the Guildhall; and after being conducted to the dais by the Mayor, touched the Mace --- the symbol of civic authority, delegated byxthexecutarixxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx to the Mayor and

Inside the Guildhall, Her Majesty inspected the two charters granted by King Henry II. Then followed an inspection of the King's Royal Rifle Corps --- marking another anniversary. It was just two hundred years ago, that this famous regiment was founded.

After the inspection - march past.

This was the Corps in which Sir Anthony Eden saw service in the First World War --- and the Prime Minister and Lady Eden were also present. It was during this visit, that Sir Anthony reported to Her Majesty on the Conference at Geneva --- which he reviewed in a spirit of sober confidence.
