One of the most important of the social events in Ireland is the Dublin Horse Show at Ballsbridge Showgrounds; and the shields of the competing nations showed that it is a truly international affair. The jumping was of such a high standard that many who appeared to be giving a faultless performance, did were not even placed. This is Ireland's Lt. Cullinan on "Greenere"

Sweden came to grief when twelve-year-old Bimbo stuck on the wall. A The only two women competitors in this event came from Great Britain. This is Miss Susan Whitehead on "Eforegiot". Miss Whitehead was well in the running for first prize --- but afault in the final round, brought her down to second place.

It was a competitor from Italy who proved to be the toughest competition; here is a perfect round from LT. D'Inzeo, which gave him first place. His horse was Irish-bred --- and named "The Quiet Man".
