This was one of the planes in which a scientific expedition from Norway set out to observe and film a total eclipse of the sun in June 1954. These taking part included the Commander-in-Chief of the Norwegian Air Force, members of the Royal Astronomical Society. and compramen and screening at the Royal Astronomical

The plane took off and climbed to a height of fifteen thousand feet --- to a point approximately midway between Oslo and Stavanger. It was a serious and normal activity on the part of the astronomers and others whose interest 🚒 was devoted to observing the phenomens of the universe; and this film has been held up for eighteen months, because it was feared that its release at the time, might have brought ridicule on their o bservations of the normal eclipse. Because those inside the plane spotted something else after the eclipse. The chief cameraman got his camera ready as quickly as possible, and was able to shoot the last ten seconds of what they saw. X Two silvery discs ---- in the top left-hand corner of the picture now before you. The picture has been greatly enlarged from the size photographed by the miniature camera -- and here it has been enlarged even more --- so there has been considerable logs of quality as a result. But the two objects are clearly to be seen --- estimated to be travelling at * tremendous kx speed. Those who were in the plane and saw the objects have refused to offer any explanation. The glass windows had been removed from the plane --- and that seems to offset any the likelihhod of reflection. So you can please yourself whether you say they were flying saucers ---or wait for more evidence.
