In the frozen wastes of the Greenland Ice Cap, Army Engineers are building barracks that can be occupied all the year round. First of all, special excavators cut through solid blocks of ice to make trenches.

In the trenches they fix supports and walls and roofs. And when the job is done --- the troops take shelter from Greenland gales and Arctic cold; and keep --- comparatively --- warm.
