Admird Earl Mountbatten, the First Sea Lord, and Countess
Mountbatten were cheered by a large crowd and editable, welcomed
by the Prime Minister, Mr Nehru, when the minister at the start
of a week's visit to India. There were greetings also and garlands
fax from friends who remembered the Admiral as the last Vicercy
of the old India and the first Governor-General of the new.

One of the first duties performed by the visitors was a visit to the Memorial to Mahatma Gandhiz; where they laid wreathse in tribute to the man who was revered as a saint in his lifetime, and whose funeral drew crowds of many millions. It will be recalled that Earl Mountbatten had attended that funeral, during his period of office.

For this return visit to the Memorial, Earl Mountbatten had removed his shoes, in accordance with custom.

Whilst in New Delhi, a call wwas made on the President at what had formerly been the Vicercy's official home, Vicercgal Ledge. A At night, there were special celebrations in honour of the visitors from Britain --- and many exchanges of gifts, and tokens of friendship.
