

After a luncheon at the Mansion House as guests of the Lord Mayor of London, Marshal Bulganin and Mr Krushev went for a trip on the River Thames in a Port of London launch from Westminster Pier to Greenwich. There they were entertained at a dinner in the magnificent Painted Hall of the Royal Naval College. The two Russian leaders sat on either side of the First Lord of the Admiralty.

On the following day, Marshal Bulganin and Mr Krushev paid a visit to the Atomic Energy Research Station Centre at Harwell..... where they were shown round by Sir Edwin Plowden, the Authority Chairman, and Sir John Cockcroft, the Director. ^ And this was followed by a visit to Oxford.

Windsor was on the next day's programme; and here the newly-~~new~~-familiar high-speed procession roared up to the castle to call upon the Queen.

It was at Windsor that Princess Anne was introduced to Nikki --- the three-months-old bear cub presented to her by the Russian visitors. Nikki afterwards went to stay at the London Zoo.

Another item in London was a visit to ~~the L.C.C. at County Hall~~ the L.C.C. at County Hall, where Mayors of London boroughs were introduced. ^

And then --- at London Airport --- a Britannia airliner was inspected, before the flight to Birmingham to have a look at the British Industries Fair. Not surprisingly, Marshal Bulganin and Mr Krushev were said to be feeling tired as the result of their many engagements; and the Birmingham visit was cut shorter than originally planned; but they made a comprehensive tour of the Exhibition.

From Birmingham they went to the R.A.F. Station at Marham in Norfolk and saw some of the latest of Britain's warplanes..... ^ ~~after~~ after which ~~the~~ fighters gave a breath-taking demonstration of formation flying.

To wind up the day, the Russian leaders went into the married quarters and talked to a serving R.A.F. Corporal and his wife and family.
