

At Campobasso in the south of Italy is held one of the most unusual of all processions. Children are mounted on an iron framework built two hundred years ago; and ride through the town giving an impression of flying angels. The celebration dates back to the seventeenth century, when pilgrims returning from the Holy Land displayed their religious fervour to those who had stayed at home.
